*It's not chess but If you know wine, you know immediately who we are going to present.
We are in Piedmont region, precisely in the Langhe.*

The territory of the Langhe, situated in southern Piedmont forms a natural amphitheater. The word Langhe in Latin means “tongue,” its name due to its shape. The soil of the Langhe is largely of sedimentary and marine origin and contains a fair percentage of clay, sand and limestone.

Older soils, known as Serravalian, can be found in the Barolo area in the central southern part of Serralunga, on the eastern side of Monforte and in Barbaresco in San Rocco Seno d'Elvio and Treiso. Younger soils, known as Helvetian, comprise much of the communes of La Morra, Verduno and Barolo. We also find the formation of Lequio soils in the municipalities of Dogliani, Farigliano and Clavesana.

The Langhe area is dominated by a temperate cold subcontinental climate with precise characteristics found only in this territory: the protective effect of the Alpine chain and the influence of mild and humid currents from the Ligurian Sea to the south; these factors in contribute the uniqueness of the climate throughout the Piedmont region. The presence of valleys and hills at different altitudes, as well as different exposures and breezes, create an incredible variety of different microclimates. As a result, particular conditions allow the grapes to ripen with a multitude of expressions. The Dogliani area in the southern reaches of the Langhe, being closer to the Ligurian Alps, has a very cool climate and is characterized by narrow and high hilly ridges facing the cold Cuneo plain.

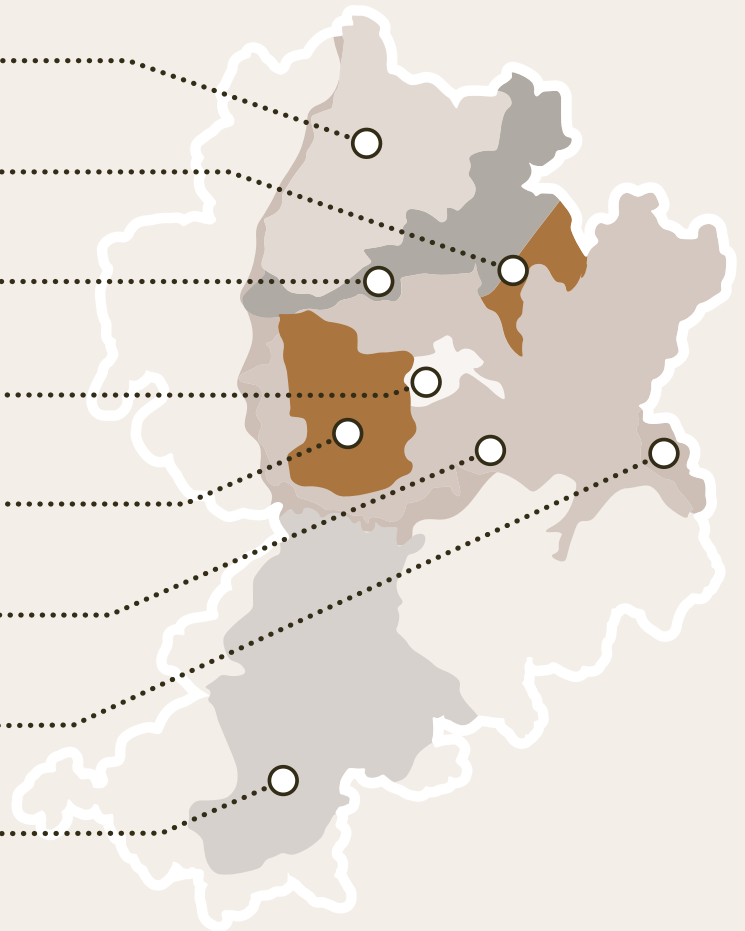

the King and Queen of Italian Wine

1. History

Barolo is actually about 50 years older than Barbaresco and was named after a noblewoman, the Marchesa de Barolo, in the 1850's. Barolo takes its name from a small village in Langhe. There are 11 local communes that comprise the Barolo production zone. Originally, Barolo was a very different wine than the style we enjoy today. A good deal of Barolo was made as a rich, sweet, fruity red wine that was much closer to ruby Port or a very fruit-forward Shiraz. This sweetness was favored, as it offset the astringency and bitterness of the wine's young tannins.

Barbaresco: The origins of this aristocratic wine are of various origins: some say that the Gauls came to Italy because they were attracted by the wine of Barbaritium. In ancient times the place where today stands the village of Barbaresco was covered by a forest so impenetrable as to allow the Ligurians who had taken refuge there to find escape from the Roman cavalry. Precisely because it remained alien to the boundaries of their domains, the Romans called it barbarica silva; this is one theory about the origin of the word Barbaresco.

2. Area

The Barolo area has intermediate/slightly warm temperatures, being positioned in a particular area protected from the winds but influenced both by the alpine currents and by the ascents of warm and humid air from the Tanaro valley. There are three hilly ridges that comprise the area which determine a variety of landscapes and, consequently, microclimates.

The Barbaresco area tends to be more homogeneous, with milder temperatures and less abundant rainfall. The landscape characterized by the narrow valleys generates stronger winds than the two previous areas.

3. Soil

The main difference in Barolo and Barbaresco is in the soils. Barbaresco's soil has more nutrients, and, because of this, the wines don't exude as much tannin as Barolo. Both wines smell of roses, perfume, and cherry, and tend to have notable persistence. The difference is in the finish; the tannins aren't quite as firm in Barbaresco, as compared to Barolo.

Nebbiolo grapes perform well in calcareous soils. If we look at the composition of the soils of Barbaresco and Barolo, they both contain a fair amount of calcareous marl. Calcareous marl is basically a lime-rich clay-based soil. The lime adds a higher pH (more alkaline) which, interestingly enough, makes the vines produce Nebbiolo grapes with a lower pH (i.e. more acidic), which in turn promotes longer aging capability in these wines.

4. Aging

Aging for these two wines varies slightly, with Barolo aged a minimum of three years before release, whereas Barbaresco requires only two years. These aging requirements increase for riserva versions, with Barolo riserva requiring five years, while it is four years for a Barbaresco riserva.

La Ganghija

The word ganghija in Piemontese dialect means vine tendril and symbolizes something small but mighty, while the sun in the logo represents the fact that nothing will ever exist without it.

Established in 2004, the Ganghija winery is owned by Enzo Rapalino – who serves as winemaker - and his wife Milena; their family assists with everyday chores. The production of wine is fairly recent for the Rapalino family, but the work in the vineyards has gone on for many generations; currently, the family farms 22 hectares of vineyards situated in the town of Treiso, Magliano Alfieri, and Alba.

La Ganghija located five kilometers south of Barbaresco, with vineyards at the highest elevations. Their Barbaresco vineyards are in some of the best sites within the Treiso commune: Giacosa cru, giving powerful and structured wines, and Bricco di Treiso and Giacone crus, giving more elegant and balanced wines. La Ganghija Barbaresco has an aging potential of 20-30 years.

This Barbaresco comes from the oldest vineyard of La Ganghija planted in the Giacosa cru in 1952. The soil here is very rich in marl and clay, contributing to very structured wines with thick tannins. A traditional winemaking technique (fermentation in oak, long maceration on the skins, and manual punching down) is able to develop a classic, balanced and elegant wine, with a long aging potential of at least 20-30 years. Giacosa is also a frazione of the Treiso village where the Rapalino family comes from.

The Pecchenino wine estate dates to the end of the 1800's and has always been a family-run business; the property in fact has been handed down from father to son for generations. Records from the early 1900's show that the farm, owned and run by Attilio, the current generation's grandfather, originally consisted of just a little over 8 hectares.

At the beginning of the 1970's it passed into the hands of his son Marino and then in 1987 to grandsons Orlando and Attilio, who expanded their business by acquiring new land and vineyards. It now consists of 35 hectares, 26 of which are in the town of Dogliani and five in Monforte D'Alba. Lisa, Orlando's daughter and her cousin Anna have also recently started working in the family business.

The Pecchenino firm owns two wine cellars, a historical one in Dogliani and another one recently built in Monforte d'Alba to produce Barolo. The area of Dogliani is especially suited to the cultivation of the Dolcetto grape; Dolcetto represents 70 % of Pecchenino's production. The winery in Monforte D'Alba, the result of the company's investments in the Barolo area, was purchased in 2013 and has recently been renovated.

Their cultivation techniques have always complied with a highly sustainable approach, without the use of herbicides, phytosanitary or chemical fertilizers. The vineyards are planted with grass between the rows to obtain better soil softness and avoid erosion phenomena.

While mainly known for their Dolcetto, Pecchenino also produces an unforgettable trio of Barolo from single vineyards.



Le Coste

First produced in 2004, Le Coste is one of the few single vineyard wines from this cru available in the United States. Only four acres in size, this vineyard is home to vines over 20 years old that have very low yields, of less than one kilo per vine. The microclimate is distinguished by large amounts of calcareous marl which results in a wine that distinguishes itself with a clean and vibrant fruit character.



San Giuseppe

San Giuseppe is made from Nebbiolo cultivated on two vineyards, totaling just over three acres. The yield from each vine is extremely low - only one kilo per vine. This low yield is achieved by thinning the vines in July and pruning the bottom half of the bunches in August, promoting better maturation in the remaining grapes. This painstaking process ensures that only the best Nebbiolo makes its way to the Pecchenino winery. The resulting wine is aged in large botti, allowing the tannins to round out without masking this wine's rich fruit aromatics.



Bussia

Bussia is one of the most historical and prestigious vineyards located in Monforte d'Alba, southeast of the village of Barolo. Examples of Barolo from this commune are characterized by a potent structure, an extraordinary depth of flavor and an uncommon aging potential. The production style is traditional, with a long fermentation with native yeasts and a long maceration on the skins. The oak used for aging is not toasted and of the highest quality, to enhance the distinctive features of the Bussia terroir into the wine.
